TJJ FAMILY

The period between Passover and Shavuot is particularly significant. During these days, we engage in a ritual known as counting the Omer, where we count each day for forty-nine days, culminating on the fiftieth day with the celebration of Shavuot. This marks the moment when the Israelites received the Torah at Mount Sinai.

This journey began when we were slaves in Egypt. At that time, we were at our lowest point, both spiritually and emotionally, lacking freedom and stability. Our exodus from Egypt symbolized the start of a transformative journey from enslavement to spiritual enlightenment and maturity.

This transformation is marked by the counting of the Omer. Each day of counting represents a step in our growth and development. Starting from day one, progressing to day two, and continuing until day seven, which marks the completion of the first week. As slaves, we were like children—unstable and without the freedom to make our own choices. The counting process symbolizes our gradual development. By the time we reach day fifty, we have matured into adults—satisfied, connected, and strong.

Rabbi Moshe Shapiro offers a profound comparison between this process and two phrases from the Torah that describe the reunion of Esau and Jacob after years of separation. Esau says, "Yesh li rav" (I have a lot), indicating that while he possesses much,

he is not truly satisfied and always craves more. In contrast, Jacob says, "Yesh li kol" (I have everything), expressing a sense of completeness and contentment. Notably, the Hebrew word "kol" has the numeric value of fifty, which aligns with the concept that true maturity and satisfaction are achieved when one accepts their reality and recognizes their stability.

This period of counting the Omer prepares us to receive the Torah, which is viewed as a guide for living a fulfilling and purposeful life. The ultimate purpose of creation, according to Jewish tradition, is for humanity to uphold and live by the teachings of the Torah.
